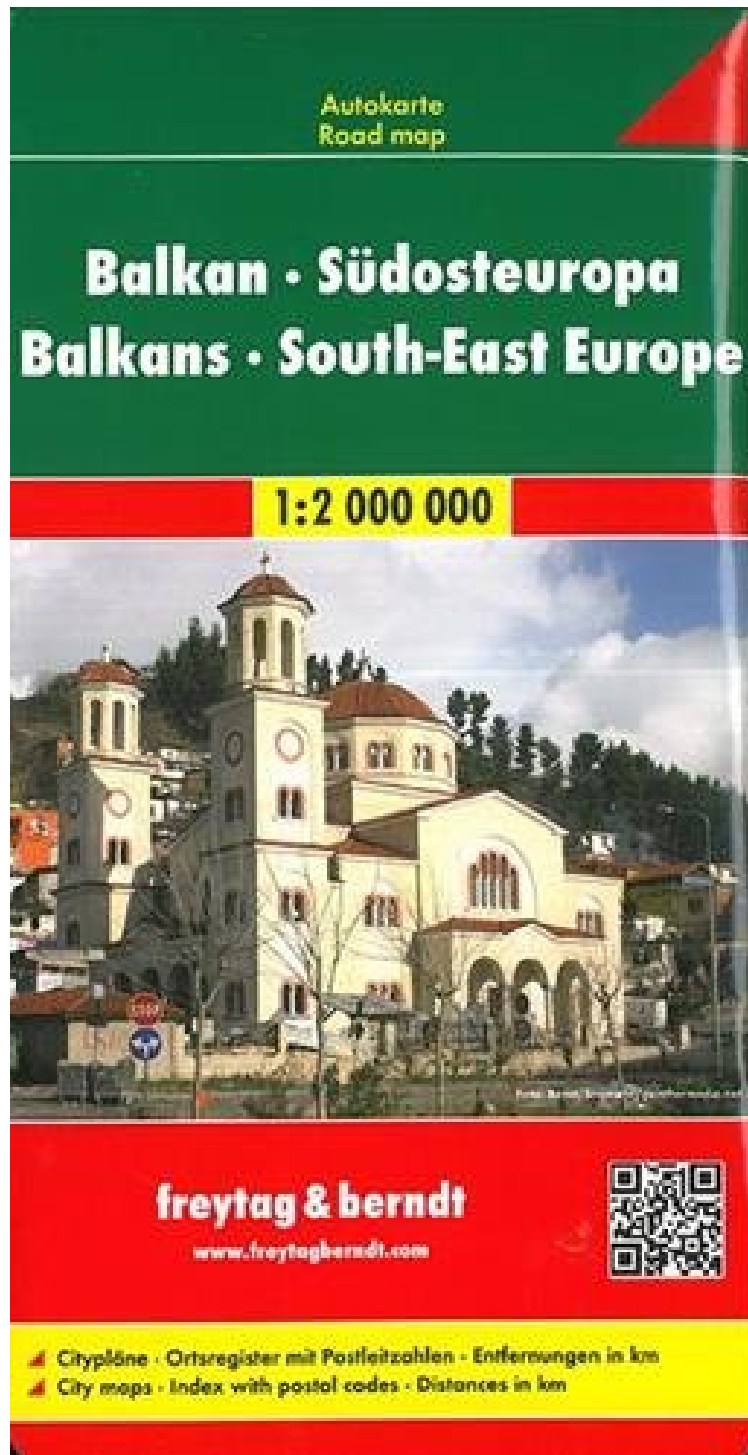

LeDuMy wife and I have used the Freytag Berndt 1:800,000 map of Turkey for extensive travel (two months at a time) and think it to be a wonder. Turks are always admiring it, telling us that it is the best map of its kind of Turkey. It stands up to a lot of abuse (although lately we have had to add some tape to the creases). We intend to use it for another trip this year. The Balkans/Southeast Europe map is up to the same standards. At 1:2,000,000, the detail is not as good as the map of Turkey -- but it covers a lot of area (including southern Italy, western Anatolia, much of the Ukraine), and all of Greece. It is ideal for planning (for which I am using it now), and would be good for general travel. However, I suspect that when we get to the Balkans we will pick up road maps for the individual countries -- ones which show minor roads. If you plan to visit more than one country, I don't think you will go wrong getting this map. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
